DII Women's Basketball**Cedarville on AMC Streak****72 consecutive conference wins****Feb. 27, 2006****By MARK WOMACK, Cedarville Sports Information**

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - The NAIA Division II No. 1 ranked Cedarville University (Ohio) women's basketball team wrapped up its third straight unbeaten season in the American Midwest Conference South Division with an 85-61 home victory on Feb. 18 against Malone College (Ohio).

The Lady Jackets, 27-3 overall and 18-0 AMC, extended their unbeaten conference winning streak to 69 in a row dating back to Dec. 7, 2002 when they lost a 78-71 decision at home to Ohio Dominican University. Throw in the three AMC Championship Game victories that CU has picked up when the South Division champ meets the North Division winner and the string is 72 straight.

The AMC is regarded as one of the top basketball conferences in NAIA Division II. While the Great Plains Athletic Conference owns the last five national titles, the AMC won the two championships immediately preceding the GPAC's run. Cedarville has been close to breaking it with back-to-back national runner-up finishes in 2004 and 2005.

Senior center **Emily Delimpo** is the lone four-year player on the Lady Jackets' roster and is just the third player in school history with more than 1,500 points and 1,000 rebounds. Cedarville has posted a 71-1 record in the league during her career and is 127-11 overall.
