OHIOLINK UPDATE

Since becoming operational with OhioLINK on September 3rd, material use activity in the system for the Centennial Library has been exceptional. In October, we experienced 1,593 transactions (books borrowed or loaned), bringing our total since September 3rd to over 2,000 transactions. While the Centennial Library is currently a net borrower in the system, our desire is for a borrowing/lending balance over the course of the academic year so that we can be a good partner with the other institutions in the system. Data from the borrowing activities of our faculty and students is being used to evaluate the adequacy of the Centennial Library collection.

REMINDER: When you initiate a borrowing request through the OhioLINK system, please remember that the Centennial Library staff will NOT notify you when the item is received. You must view your circulation record by requesting that option from the Centennial Library catalog menu screen. Type in your name and bar code number, and then select "Display Held Items." If you have requested an item through OhioLINK, it will appear on the screen. If the status is "requested" or "in transit," the item is not yet available. When the status is "circulation desk," you may pick the item up at the Library Circulation Desk. IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT WE HOLD THE ITEM FOR YOU FOR ONLY 10 DAYS. Please use the system responsibly by picking up those items that you have requested.

NEW ACQUISITIONS LIST

This is a reminder that the most recent list of new materials added to the Library collection is now provided electronically through the Library Home Page. To get to the Library Home Page, select "Centennial Library" from the College Home Page on Netscape. There are two paths to the new acquisitions list, one fairly simple, the other more complex, but the second provides additional information sources for faculty and staff. The simplest access is to scroll down on the Centennial Library Home Page and select "What's New" and from there select "New Acquisitions." The second method of access will take you to the new acquisition list, but also to other sources of information that might be helpful. Use the following sequence of screens from the Centennial Library Home Page:

"Library Departments" "Collection Services" "Acquisitions" "Services" Scroll down to "Information for Faculty and Staff" Select "New Acquisitions List"

INSTRUCTIONAL VIDEOS AVAILABLE

Two library resource instructional videos are available for personal and classroom use. SEARCHING INFOTRAC SEARCHBANK gives a 20 minute overview of searching any of the Information Access Searchbank's databases via the World Wide Web. The Centennial Library currently subscribes to four of these databases: Expanded Academic Index ASAP, Business and Company Profile ASAP, National Newspaper Index, and the Health Reference Center.

SEARCHING PSYCLIT ON DOS is a 15 minute overview of the PsycLit database. Beginning with a search question, the video shows the user how to identify key terms and how to search those terms effectively by using either the thesaurus or free-text searching. The Centennial Library provides both the DOS and WINDOWS versions of PsycLit through CedarNet. Even though searching the WINDOWS version is not addressed on the video, the concepts of database searching are covered quite well.

Both videos are on reserve at the Media Resource Center service desk on the lower level of the Library.

USER EDUCATION

Requests for user education sessions led by Library reference staff were up significantly during Fall, 1996 compared to 1995. There is much to learn about electronic resources, the Centennial Library on-line catalog, OhioLINK, and other valuable print and INTERNET resources. Since the demand for these sessions is high, it is not too early to begin planning for the Winter Quarter and reserve time on the Library reference staff schedule.
