Program Notes

Sacred Fragments

Steven Winteregg

Sacred Fragments is built upon musical pieces taken from the traditional Easter hymn, *O Sacred Heart Now Wounded* by Hans Leo Hassler. The musical materials are drawn from the exploration of each phrase of the hymn involving such things as its original, inversion, retrograde, retrograde inversion, change of rhythm or change of octave. The original hymn is heard at the beginning and the end of the composition while the middle consists of a constant development and variation of the phrases. In other words, the “fragments” becoming the building blocks of the piece.

The composition also explores the various emotions associated with the crucifixion of Christ such as Jesus’s pain and agony, Mary’s horror and distress, and the disciples’ memories and sadness. Out of this range of emotions emerges the triumph of Christ with J. S. Bach’s setting of the hymn. It is a reminder to us that Jesus can help us find peace and victory out of the chaos of life.
