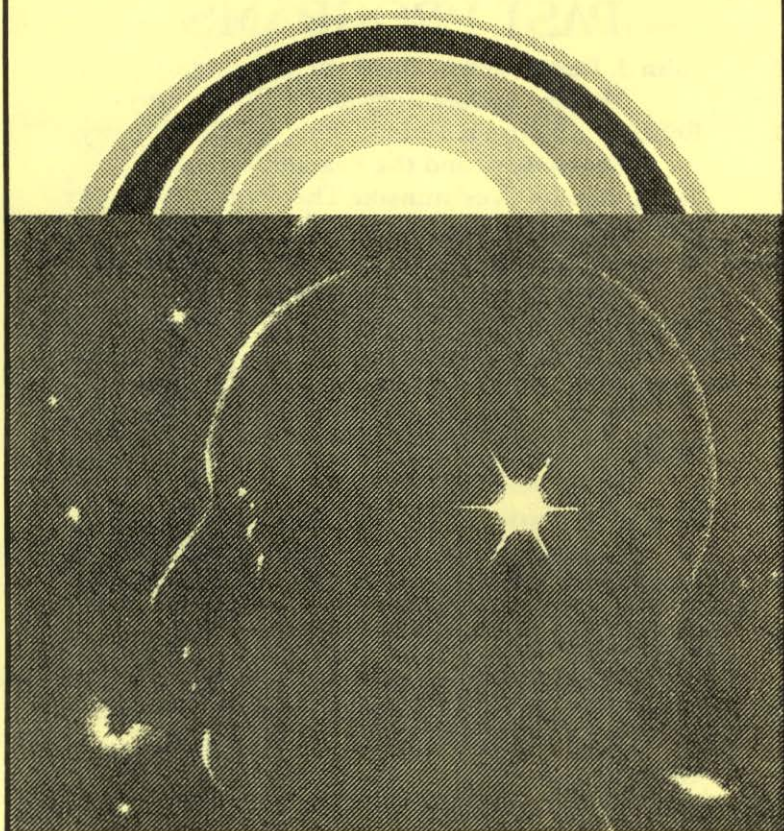

LECTURER

Dr. Norman L. Geisler is presently Dean of Liberty Center for Christian Scholarship at Liberty University. He previously served on the faculties of Dallas Theological Seminary, Trinity Evangelical College and Divinity School, and Detroit Bible College.

Dr. Geisler has taught philosophy, ethics, and related subjects for nearly 30 years. He has lectured in 49 states and 18 countries and has authored or co-authored more than 20 books including: *Introduction to Philosophy*, *Philosophy of Religion*, *The Creator in the Courtroom*, *Cosmos: Carl Sagan's Religion for the Scientific Mind*, *Is Man the Measure: An Evaluation of Contemporary Humanism*, *Origin Science: A Proposal for the Creation-Evolution Controversy*, and *The Reincarnation Sensation*.

His pulpit ministry has included churches in Michigan, Illinois, and Texas, an international radio ministry, and speaking engagements at churches, retreats, conferences, and colleges and universities.

An accomplished debater on social and philosophical issues, Dr. Geisler has appeared on numerous radio and television programs and has been quoted by many major newspapers and magazines including *Time*. NBC and CBS have featured him on nationally televised news programs.

Holding the B.A. and M.A. degrees from Wheaton College and the Ph.D. from Loyola University, Chicago, he has done postgraduate work at Wayne State University and Northwestern University. He is listed in *Writers Who's Who*, *Men of Achievements*, and *Who's Who in Religion*.
