



CLASSIC OUTLOOK – 2006

With two new teams and a few nine-inning games, the EMU Sarasota Spring Classic takes on a new look in 2006. In addition to Kenyon College (OH), back for its seventh Classic, and, Trinity International University (IL) which returns for its second year, the Classic will welcome newcomers Cedarville University (OH) and Northwester College (IA). Kenyon College returns to the Classic as the reigning champion after waltzing through the Classic with a 5-2 record in 2005.

Host school, **Eastern Mennonite University**, was also 5-2 in 2005, but lost the head to head tiebreaker to Kenyon to finish runner-up.

The second new look features a traditional baseball aspect, a result of a recent ruling by the NCAA. According to the governing body to which Kenyon and EMU belong, all games that are not true double-headers (two games between the same teams) must contain nine full innings. Thus, all of the games featuring Kenyon and EMU will consist of nine innings unless the double-header rule can be applied. In a nine-inning game, a 10-run mercy rule may be applied after seven innings; no mercy rule exists for NCAA teams in a scheduled double-header.

For the second straight year, the Classic will feature a "come and go" feel to it. Host school EMU will open the Classic with a 12:30 game on Saturday, but then must leave after Wednesday's game to return to Virginia for conference games on Saturday. Only Cedarville and TIU will see the Classic from start to finish as Northwestern and Kenyon will not play until Monday.

The 2005 Classic uses a modified round-robin format and provides each team with the number of games that it wanted. The Classic will recognize a champion and runner-up with overall winning percentage being the determinant. An All-Tournament team will be selected by vote of the coaches.

HOW THE CLASSIC CAME TO BE

During the 1995 and 1996 seasons, the EMU baseball team competed in the Kenyon College Baseball Invitational in Tallahassee, Florida. The Kenyon tournament "was an ideal baseball week" according to former EMU head coach **Rob Roeschley**, but freezing temps in 1996 left the Royals dreaming of warmer weather and greater crowds.

"On the last day in Tallahassee, we froze our tails off," said Roeschley. "We knew the weather was a fluke, but Sarasota was much warmer that same week."

Recognizing Sarasota Christian School's field to be a prime location, Roeschley presented the idea of a tournament to SCS's superintendent **Gene Miller**, a '79 EMU graduate.

The idea was very warmly received.

"The word 'warmly' is the key word," stated Roeschley. "Gene agreed that if we are going to travel all the way to Florida then we should at least go somewhere with warmer weather."

With everything still at the "dream" stage, EMU's regional director of development **Sam Weaver** entered the picture. Weaver's efforts included organizing several generous patrons in the Sarasota area to sponsor the event, and the idea quickly became a reality.

"His enthusiasm for this event was contagious," praised Roeschley. "He knew the right people to contact -- those with a love for baseball, EMU and Sarasota. There's no better place for EMU Baseball to be during spring break, and Sam knew that."

Through the sponsorships, a reduction in costs is provided to the participating teams that in turn makes the Classic possible. Classic sponsors are listed inside the front cover of this program.

PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS

Eastern Mennonite University is a Christian liberal arts institution connected with Mennonite Church USA. EMU offers majors in 50 fields, as well as seminary programs and master's degrees in business, conflict transformation, counseling, and education. A member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the university maintains 17 varsity sports for its 1,400 students. EMU's hillside campus is located in Harrisonburg, Virginia, in the heart of the Shenandoah Valley, approximately two hours from the nation's capital.

Cedarville University is a Christ-centered learning community with over 70 academic majors and programs for its 3,100 students. With roots that trace to 1887, the college has served as a Baptist college of arts and sciences for over 50 years. A small town of about 4,000, Cedarville, Ohio, is located between Columbus, Dayton, and Cincinnati. A member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, the school offers 16 varsity sports.

Kenyon College is a private liberal arts institution located in the picturesque village of Gambier, Ohio, about 50 miles north of Columbus. Founded in 1824 by Episcopal Bishop Philander Chase, the college is reputable for strong academic programs and annually sending a large percentage of students to leading graduate and professional schools. Kenyon's enrollment of 1,550 students is divided equally between men and women.

Nortwestern College, with over 50 different majors and programs, provides an academic tradition of Christian education with strong commitment to the liberal arts. Located in Orange City, Iowa, a town of 5,600 located in the northwest corner of the state, the school traces its roots to 1882 and the Reformed Church of America. A member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, Northwestern offers 15 varsity sports for its 1270 students.

Trinity International University, with an enrollment of 1,267 students, is located in Deerfield, Illinois. Trinity offers over 30 academic programs, including graduate and divinity degrees. As a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, the school offers eight varsity sports for its men and women. The education at Trinity revolves around five main goals: Christ centeredness, comprehensive education, community, church connectedness, and cultural engagement.

SEASON OUTLOOK

Mark Mace enters his first season as head coach at his alma mater. Despite having 10 new players on a roster of 19, the Royals have established a goal of making the ODAC tournament. To do that, EMU needs the combination of seasoned veterans and talented newcomers to step up to the plate and perform.

Among the returning players, senior Kenny Riley will anchor the catching position and also see time in left field. He will alternate with freshman Andrew Pittman, a transfer from Division II Shippensburg.

First base will also be a veteran position for EMU as senior Casey Armstrong and junior Chad Johns will share time on the bag and also as the designated hitter. Second base will feature one of the team's key newcomers in sophomore transfer Jameson Jarvis, who comes from Division II Shepherd College.

On the left side, short stop will be filled by sophomore Zachary Hawke. Senior Michael Kniss will see most of the time at the hot corner, making a transition from second base where he spent time as a starter in each of the last three seasons. Providing depth in the infield will be freshmen Derek Butler and Jeff Gingrich.

While the infield will be comprised of many of the team's returning veterans, the outfield will see more new faces. Left field will primarily be filled by the combination of Riley and Pittman, who are both new to the position. Speedy junior transfer Brandon Zollman will man center field after transferring from Division I Western Carolina. Right field will primarily be filled by freshman Zach Polloni, a converted catcher. Providing depth to the outfield will be senior Kolbe Subjeck, sophomore Jared Balinski, and freshman Ben Moyer.

The Royals expect to be pretty solid offensively but a few more question marks remain about the pitching staff. The lone senior of the staff is Drew Cobb. Joining Cobb as one of the top starters will be Armstrong.

Another likely starter/long reliever is freshman Michael Chrisman. Junior Josh Pfeifer and Zollman will join Cobb to give the Royals three left-handers on the staff. In addition to the lefties, the Royals will also look to freshmen Andy Fainter and Darrell Renner.

Despite so many newcomers and so much youth, Mace has been refreshed by the leadership of the few juniors and seniors on the roster. While a challenge awaits Mace in his first season, he is excited about the opportunities for this team.

SEASON OUTLOOK

The Yellow Jackets open the 2006 baseball season on Feb. 28 with a single game at Cumberlands (Ky.) before the schedule gets even more intense. Cedarville will play nine games during spring on March 4-11 in the Eastern Mennonite Classic in Sarasota, Fla. and then wrap it up with a doubleheader at Berea (Ky.). No less than 50 of the team's 51 scheduled contests occur in March and April.

Greg Hughes is back for his seventh season as head coach. He has aspirations of returning the program to playing competitive baseball similar to when the Jackets won back-to-back NCCAA Midwest Region championship banners in 2003 and 2004.

The top returning player is senior lefthander Matt Bonin. He has a 15-14 career record on the mound with a 3.52 earned run average. The Patton, Pa. native has been the winning pitcher in over one-third of the Jackets' victories during his career. Bonin was 6-3 with a 3.31 ERA last spring. He led the American Mideast Conference at 9.66 strikeouts per 9 innings and was voted to the All-AMC South Division Second Team. Bonin was also an NAIA and NCCAA All-America Scholar-Athlete.

Andrew Noble, Kiel Boynton, and Alex Pummell are the other returning seniors. Noble, a first baseman, is a .246 career hitter with three homers and 48 runs batted in. Pummell has made 55 appearances with 28 starts behind the plate while Boynton has been used primarily as a relief pitcher. They join Bonin as four-year players on the CU roster.

The top returning hitter is junior Richie Reeder. The York, Pa. product ranked third on the 2005 squad with a .328 batting average and eight doubles. The infielder has a .326 average at the plate during his first two seasons in the program. Another key hitter back is sophomore first baseman/pitcher Matt Houchin. He produced a .284 average as a rookie with six doubles, three triples, a homer, and 23 RBI's.

SEASON OUTLOOK

Coming off of a 21-12 mark last season and a school record for wins, the 2006 Kenyon College baseball roster is packed with depth, maybe more so than ever. Having graduated just one senior from last year's squad, the Lords look poised to climb up the North Coast standings and make a run at the postseason playoffs.

The Lords have another promising group of freshmen ready to join the club, but the returning players will be asked to shoulder the bulk of the workload. Leading the way will be two All-Region performers in seniors Matt Marcincyk and Michael Coe. Marcincyk will return to the heart of the Lords' batting order and continue his assault on the Kenyon College record books. In 2005, he was named to the All-Mideast Region's Second Team after hitting .422 in 33 games. Marcincyk already is the College's single-season record holder for most hits, doubles, and runs scored. With three seasons of collegiate baseball behind him, he is Kenyon's career leader in batting average, on-base percentage, and doubles.

Coe comes off a 2005 campaign in which he posted a 9-4 pitching record and established the College's single season mark for wins. He also had a 3.48 ERA, the best average turned in by a Kenyon starting pitcher in the past five seasons. Additionally, Coe led the Lords in innings pitched, complete games, and strikeouts. He was named to the All-Mideast Region Third Team.

Other key returning position players include senior catcher Tyler Kavanaugh, as well as juniors Brendan Holsberry, Carlin Shoemaker, and Chad Rothschild. Kavanaugh ripped 21 RBI and threw out six would-be base stealers. Holsberry was brilliant defensively and also hit .333. Shoemaker posted a remarkable .410 batting average to go along with 34 RBI and 28 runs scored. Rothschild added a .366 average and led the Lords with 13 stolen bases. That core of players led Kenyon to single-season team records in runs, batting, slugging, and on-base percentage.

On the mound, the Lords will return all starters from 2005. With Coe leading the way and junior Dan Shelley back for another season, the KC pitching staff is loaded with talent and fire power.

SEASON OUTLOOK

In 2005, head coach Dave Nonnemacher had 19 underclassmen on the roster and started six of them. The end result was a 7-17 Great Plains Athletic Conference mark. Seeing more competitive play and promising pitching last season, Nonnemacher saw signs for encouragement.

In 2006, the Red Raiders return experienced players behind the plate and on the mound. Sophomore catcher Codie Zeutenhorst was an honorable mention all-GPAC selection in 2005, hitting at a .301 clip with 24 RBI's. The main pitching duties will be shared by juniors Koerselman and Dustin Meyn and sophomore Joseph Grady. Koerselman logged 57.1 innings last season and notched 54 strikeouts, while Meyn posted a 4-5 record. Grady compiled a 3.96 ERA in 61.1 innings pitched. Nonnemacher also expects freshman Trevor Kuiper to add depth to the Raider bullpen.

Lunning, the Raider third basemen, will be the lone upperclassmen in the infield. NWC's lead-off batter had a .273 batting average in 2005 and provides speed on the bases. Lunning connected for nine doubles and three triples last season. Three freshmen will likely fill the remainder of the infield spots: shortstop Grant Wall, second baseman Austin Malone and first baseman Jacob Jansen. On the grass, freshman Levi Roth will patrol center field while Hector and sophomore Joseph Heitritter, both former infielders, will offer experienced play.

A quality freshmen class will be one of the building blocks for the Red Raider program along with a capable pitching staff. "This is an up-tempo group of players with a commitment to team and hard work," said Nonnemacher. "We believe we are capable of a top 8 conference finish." In order for that to come to fruition, the Raiders are focusing on improving their defensive play.
