National Publication Ranks Cedarville's Online Masters Program Among Best in Country; Second in Ohio

CEDARVILLE, OHIO – Cedarville University's online Master of Education program gained high marks by BestColleges.com in a national ranking of programs. In the 2015 ranking, Cedarville's program ranked 23rd in the United States and is the second-highest ranked program in Ohio. Franciscan University of Steubenville was ranked 22nd.

Schools are ranked according to admissions, enrollment and graduation and retention rates. Schools within these rankings outperform other schools in education quality and also have higher retention and graduation rates than all other accredited public and private schools offering master's degrees.

Cedarville's affordable Master of Education is a 34-credit program. Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree in education from a regionally accredited institution and be currently licensed, or have previously had a license to teach. Cedarville's program is designed to help teachers increase their classroom effectiveness by preparing educators to assume leadership roles in their schools and in the teaching profession. The program is designed specifically to accommodate the schedules of busy teachers.

Our academically rich programs develop technological and pedagogical skills in educators to effectively teach the 21st Century learner," affirmed Jeremy Ervin, Ph.D., dean of the school of education.
