





Coach Of The Year

For the second consecutive year Bill Lucas was chosen by a vote of his fellow coaches as NAIA District 22 "Coach of the Year." Now in his 10th year as head of the Marauder's cage program, Lucas coached CSU to a 21-4 regular season record, including a string of 12 straight victories.

The Marauders knocked over Youngstown State (67-52) when the Penguins were riding a string of 18 straight and were ranked second in both the UPI and AP small-college polls. Other big wins included Eastern Michigan (74-71), Capital University (63-52) and Bellarmine College (85-74).

Central State also remained unbeaten again this year against Ohio NAIA teams beating Wilberforce (76–63), Bluffton (67–54), Ohio Northern (74–71), Cedarville (71–56), Wilmington (72–56), And Defiance (56–52),

Coach Lucas' selection last year led to his being named as NAIA "Coach of the Year" in the states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, and Michigan. His three year record, including the 1968 NAIA title team, stands at 71 wins and 15 losses.
