1975 OUTLOOK

The 1975 season must be approached realistically, especially since 1974 turned out to be both disappointing and puzzling. The team finished with a 6-7 record, down from a 10-4 record the year before. No championships were won, and yet all four returning lettermen improved their averages over 1973. The newest member of the team actually finished the year with the best average. Five times the team averaged four men under 80 with the opening match of 302 standing as a new school record.

Five varsity lettermen return along with a number of good prospects. On paper, the 1975 team should be better than 1974 or 1973 teams. Hopefully, the record will reflect that improvement. The main goals are to recapture the MOC championship lost in 1974 and to win the NAIA District 22 tourney for the first time. Time will tell.
