OUTLOOK

The Jackets and Coach McGillivray are optimistic about the 1976 season. Although four starters from last year's squad were lost via graduation, the team hopes to improve on their 9-3-2 record of last season. The nucleus of the defense remains which allowed only 1.36 goals per game last season and hopes are that the offense will continue its output of 4.57 goals per game.

The defense will be lead by veteran fullbacks Ken Howard, Don Bartemus, and Warren Gifford. The other fullback position will be contended for by sophomore Warren Allan and junior Tim Stoner. Sophomores Gordon Donaldson, Benny Belleman, and Mike Mignard also figure to play key roles in the Jacket defense. The goal tending duties will be handled by Ron Clark who promises to be a real fine goal keeper. Ron's back up will be Tom Benefiel.

The midfield duties will be covered by last year's high point man, Evandro Batista, along with Joe Jenkins and Don Hare. Junior Dave Jarvis will add depth to the halfback positions.

The front line hopefuls are juniors Dave Stoner, Tom Cook, and Tom Benefiel along with seniors Paul Kester and Merle Ziegler. Coming off a knee operation, Ziegler hopes to return to his starting position at left wing which he enjoyed during the 1974 season. Freshman Tom Aitken and Dave Kolk along with junior Clay Auwarter should provide good depth for the squad at the attacking positions.

This year's schedule will be one of the toughest ever as the Jackets open on the road at Ohio University, a former NCAA contender, and a team that Cedarville has yet to defeat. Tough games are expected from the University of Cincinnati, Kent State, and the University of Dayton. Games with rivals Wittenberg University and Walsh College should prove to be highly emotional as they are two of the teams that defeated the Jackets in 1975. Very difficult games are expected with Ohio Conference powers Denison and Ohio Wesleyan both of which were defeated by the "Ville" for the first time last season. Ohio Wesleyan University finished third in the NCAA Division.
