FALL MEETINGS HELD

The college entertains Rev. Carson Fremont, missionary to the Philippines, as speaker for the annual Fall Bible Lecture Series, September 13-17.

Carson Fremont is originally from Dayton, Ohio, where he has spent twenty-five years of his life. After high school graduation and military service, Mr. Fremont pursued a major in the study of anthropology at Wheaton College. At Wheaton he also received a master's degree in the field of Christian Education.

Since 1953 Carson Fremont has been a missionary in the Philippine Islands under the auspices of the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism. He first became acquainted with the Philippines in 1945-46 when he was stationed on the islands for military duty.

Carson Fremont's particular work in the Philippines is in connection with Baptist Bible Seminary where he, as a teacher, also assumed at various times, the duties of practical work coordinator, business manager, and acting director. Vacation time was occupied by supervision of

CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

Many new improvements in the college gymnasium are evident this fall.

The first change to face the students as they enter the gym is the sparkling finish on the floor. The Hilliard Company prepared a special solution which was applied to the floor. This left the floor in a sanded condition. All boundaries and markings were repainted and the floor completely varnished.

The first varnish job did not set properly so last week the job was redone in hopes of achieving the desired finish. The second attempt appears to be successful.

Also, in the center jump circle of the floor has been painted the Yellowjackets' monogram.

The next change to catch the eye of the spectator will be the new paint on the walls of the gym. A soft, pleasing color has been used which will be enjoyable to look at, and at the same time aid in the lighting of the gym.

A training room has been set up next to the coach's office for treatment of injuries, massages, and other athletic needs.

A great deal of work has been done in fixing up the men's and woman's locker rooms. New benches have been added and both shower rooms are to be painted soon.

The improvements, together with the improvements made last year in the front addition last year, should make the Cedarville College students proud of their gymnasium.
