1984 SEASON WRAP-UP

Right before the 1984 Yellow Jacket soccer season opened, Coach John McGillivray expressed much concern over the lack of experience on his team especially at the goalkeeping slot. But the defense proved to be much better than expected by allowing no more than two goals in any one game through the first ten contests despite a 4-5-1 record. Following a 4-0 loss to NAIA-power Wilmington College, the Jacket offense began to click and C.C. won seven of its last nine outings to finish at 11-8-1.

First-year goalkeepers Dan Byrum and Jan Schaedel did a tremendous job in the nets with the help of senior back Curt Critcher. Schaedel posted two shutouts this year and the tandem combined for three others. The best outing by a C.C. goalkeeper this season came in the NAIA District 22 playoffs when Schaedel blanked Tiffin 1-0 to avenge a regular season loss to the Dragons.

Junior co-captains Tom Fite and Noel Hack paced the offensive attack scoring 30 of the team's 63 goals. Fite had an outstanding year (18 goals, 6 assists) while missing four games. Hack had both of Cedarville's goals in the 2-1 NCCAA District III championship victory at Grace.

The Jackets made their second-ever trip to the NCCAA Nationals finishing fifth in the six-team tournament held in Longview, Texas. Cedarville lost to host LeTourneau 2-1 and then defeated Roberts Wesleyan 4-1. Fite was named all-tournament after scoring one goal in each game.
