BULLDOGS HOLD ON FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Seneca, SC- The Bulldogs of Gardner-Webb University won their first-ever NCCAA Golf Championship, duplicating their first round 306 in Wednesday's final round for a 612 total. Sophomores, Brian Parker and Steve Brady led the way as each finished at 149 for the two-day event. Parker defeated teammate Brady on the third playoff hole with a four-foot birdie putt to win the individual title.

Two-time defending champion, Malone College of Ohio, finished second at 625 and North Greenville College finished third at 629. Host school, Southern Wesleyan University was fourth at 636 followed by Spring Arbor University of Michigan at 638.

The final round was played under perfect conditions in contrast to Tuesday's first round that was highlighted by strong, swirling winds up to 25 mph. Gardner-Webb played steady golf to thwart any late challenges and their 12 shot margin of victory against a quality field excited coach Tee Burton who was selected NCCAA Coach of the Year. "This is an exciting and somewhat unexpected finish to our fall schedule and we are hoping to build on this for the spring," stated Coach Burton.
