Students' Favorite Visiting Professor Concludes Living Water Conference

CEDARVILLE, OHIO – Sam Allberry, visiting professor at Cedarville University, will speak in chapel April 5 at 10 a.m. as the concluding message for the university's "Living Water" conference.

"Living Water: Living and Sharing the Gospel in a Sexually Broken World" will be held on April 4 and is the second annual apologetics and worldview conference put on by Cedarville's Center for Biblical Apologetics and Public Christianity. Allberry and Rosaria Butterfield, author and speaker on topics of sexuality and Christianity, will be the keynote speakers.

After studying theology at Wycliffe Hall in Oxford, Allberry worked at St Ebbe's Church in Oxford, ministering to university students. He has served at St. Mary's Church for almost ten years. He is now a global speaker for Ravi Zacharias International Ministries, but still preaches regularly at his home church. Allberry has been a visiting professor at CU since August 2017 and has become one of the most respected and beloved professors on campus.

Allberry is an editor for [The Gospel Coalition](#) and has authored several books, including "[Is God Anti-Gay?,"](#) "[James for You](#)" and "[Why Bother with Church?](#)" He is the founding editor of [Living Out](#), a ministry helping Christians who experience same-sex attraction stay faithful to biblical teaching and flourish in their relationship with God.

"I'm looking forward to being back in chapel," said Allberry. "Cedarville feels more and more like home, and so speaking at chapel feels like I'm opening the Scriptures with my family. And nothing beats that!"

"We'll be looking at Galatians 3:1-14 and really trying to drink in what it means to keep living by grace rather than performance," he continued. "I hope it will bring much-needed relief and solace."
