"We have a cooperative relationship with the clinic," said Dr. Douglas Anderson, chair of the department of pharmacy practice and member of the Living Well Clinic board of directors. "We want our students to learn servant-leadership and to be involved in serving the underserved. Events like these, where students can work directly with people across the Miami Valley, is very important to their education."

Anderson, along with Dr. Marc Sweeney, dean of the school of pharmacy, and Dr. John Ballentine, affiliate professor of pharmacy, will provide live music for the event. Their group, 7075 Band, offered their services when the timing worked out for all three of them to attend.
