"DASHP Symposium Event is an excellent opportunity for pharmacists, residents and students to learn from each other and not only improve patient care but advance the profession of pharmacy," said Conkey. "I am excited to be personally involved by presenting what I have learned and provide education to colleagues."

The symposium is also a way for DASHP to support pharmacy students with scholarships.
