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In Today's Technology World, Cedarville Puts Theology II Course Online

CEDARVILLE, OHIO -- A second course in Cedarville University's Bible minor program is now available online. The university just released the [Theology II](#) course, taught by [Dr. Jeremy Kimble](#), associate professor of theology. The class can be viewed at cedarville.edu/Bibleminorproject.
