

How much do you know about your own state of Ohio? It is almost certain that few people can name the leading historical spots in the state. Most people know that we have numerous colleges in Ohio but who can name all of them?

Ohio is a great manufacturing state but who could name all the various products made within the borders of the state? While Ohio has coal, salt, iron, and other native materials used in the manufacturing field, yet few of us know as much of our own state as we should.

Governor Donahey at the request of a large number of leaders in commercial, civic, and industrial lines, has issued a proclamation setting aside the week of May 21 to 28 as "Know Ohio Week."

It is the purpose of this organization to conduct through May of each year a campaign to acquaint Ohioans more fully with their own state. Ohio is more than an average state and is more in the eyes of the world than we probably realize. Now would be a good time to read up on your own state.




