**CEDARVILLE, OHIO** -- Students in Cedarville University's Lambda Pi Eta (LPH) NuNu Chapter — the communication program's honors organization — will be writing notes of encouragement to senior citizens and university professors during a March 14 event in the Tyler Digital Communication Center. The honor students' evening of encouragement will begin at 6:30 p.m.

LPH students, representing each of the majors in [Cedarville's](#) department of communication, [communication](#); [broadcasting, digital media and journalism](#); and [professional writing and information design](#), annually hold an event in honor of Pi Day, representing both the mathematical concept used to find the area and circumference of a circle and the Greek letter present in the organization's name. Students will celebrate by eating pies and writing encouraging cards to senior citizens in nursing homes and professors at the university.

"We're excited for this community outreach opportunity," said junior [communication](#) major and vice president of the LPH NuNu chapter Ellie Miskimen from Canton, Ohio. "We are going to be making coloring sheets for senior citizens and professors to put in their cards and even include Scripture verses. I hope each person who receives a card will be encouraged by them."
