Cedarville Students: Waving A Banner for Life

CEDARVILLE, OHIO -- In partnership with Columbus-based [Center for Christian Virtue](#), several [Cedarville University](#) students will participate in the annual March for Life rally at the Ohio Statehouse on Saturday, Oct. 6. The Cedarville students will be carrying a March for Life banner.

In the continued pro-life discussion, it is key for organizations to have a continued awareness of abortion legislation. Currently, pro-life advocates are adamantly opposing constitutional changes coming to Ohio's ballot this November, which would permit late-term abortions.

"The Ohio March for Life is a big part of advancing our mission, as we will be building connections that will lead to successful outreach," said Jason de Mets, president of Cedarville pro-life student org. "As abortion legislation continues to take different forms, pro-life communities continue to band together and passionately defend the sanctity of life."

"I'm so excited to attend the Ohio March for Life this year," said Autumn Sellers, a member of the Cedarville Students for Life org. "It's a great opportunity to stand for the lives of the unborn and meet others who are doing the same. Being at the march is a great opportunity to represent the students in Ohio who value life."

Cedarville students remain committed to advocating for life, and Cedarville has boldly shown support for pro-life causes. On September 26, Cedarville hosted the [Stand for Life tour](#) to educate and raise awareness about the pro-life cause and pertinent legislation. Tuesday, October 10, Jamie Curry, the regional coordinator from [Students for Life of America](#) will be on campus raising awareness about late-term abortion with the Students for Life "Late-Term Abortion on the Ballot" tour. This tour will emphasize the reality of the proposed legislation and highlight its inner workings.

Cedarville University's Center for Political Studies is hosting a town hall on Tuesday, Oct. 17, at 7:30 p.m. about Issue 1 which is on the Ohio ballot this November. Dr. Mark Caleb Smith, director of the center for political studies, and Aaron Baer, president of the Center for Christian Virtue, will speak at the event that will take place in the DeVries Theatre inside the Stevens Student Center. The event will be live streamed at cedarville.edu/issue1.
