## Artist Biography

Daniel Sachs was born and raised in Basel, Switzerland. He holds degrees from the conservatories of Basel and Lübeck, Germany. He came to the United States in 1997 to study with Prof. James Tocco at the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati, where he completed his doctorate in piano performance with a thesis about Claude Debussy's music.

Dr. Sachs' performances as soloist and chamber musician have brought him to venues such as the Fondation György Cziffra in Senlis (France), the Cité Internationale des Arts in Paris, the Musiksaal in Basel and the Tonhalle in Zürich as well as numerous other venues in Europe and the United States. He has performed with several orchestras and recorded solo works by Chopin and Rachmaninoff for the Swiss Radio.

Dr. Sachs has won prizes, stipends, awards, and scholarships in Europe and the United States. He currently teaches piano and music theory at the College of Mount St. Joseph. He lives in Lebanon, Ohio, with his wife, Rachel, and their three sons Samuel, Gabriel, and Nathaniel.
